FRANKLIN LEARNING CENTER STUDENT WINS JURORS' CHOICE AWARD IN PHILADELPHIA SKETCH CLUB EXHIBIT OF SCHOOL DISTRICT 'S ART STUDENTS

Special Teacher Award Was Also Won by Art Teacher from the Franklin Learning Center

PHILADELPHIA, PA– Feb. 24, 2019 – Tajah Green, a senior at the Franklin Learning Center, has won the Judges' Choice award in the Philadelphia Sketch Club's 35thAnnual District-Wide High School Art Show. Ms. Green wants to become an art therapist, so she can help children with life in the same way art assisted her as a child.

Ms. Green received the award for her oil-on-canvas painting "Still Life" on Sunday, Feb. 24, at a reception and awards ceremony at the club's historic South Camac St. center, where works by all of the 129 students competing were exhibited. The works included paintings, sketches, photographs and sculptures. Sixty-two of the students – including Ms. Green – received awards.

"Art helped me with my problems as a child, so I want to help other children with art to help solve their problems," said Ms. Green, who began sketching while in the fourth grade. A native of Philadelphia, she also uses her art to illustrate her poetry, and she also plays the flute. Ms. Green credits her art teacher, Christina Xiao Whitt, whose art classes she took during all of her four years at the Franklin Learning Center, with taking up painting. "Ms. Whitt pushed me into painting," said Ms. Green. "She was right. I am a painter." She said of her selection as the Judges' Choice, "It's really big. It's huge."

"Tajah is an incredibly hard worker," said Ms. Whitt, who won the Special Teacher Award during the awards ceremony. "She always seeks ways to make her work better, and she's tapped into her potential, and that makes me feel good." Ms. Whitt has both undergraduate and graduate degrees from the Tyler School of Art (Philadelphia)

Art teachers at the Philadelphia School District's high schools were asked to nominate students to compete in the exhibit, and 27 teachers from 13 high schools participated. Deborah Klose, director of Arts Education for the Philadelphia School District, said that the exhibit was the students' first experience showing their work in a prestigious venue. "It's important for the students to be recognized for their good work, and it helps with their self-esteem to feel appreciated," she said. "And who knows? There might be the next great artist among them."

Judges for the exhibit were John Schmiechen, a professional oil painter; Ted Lewis, an exhibit curator; and Joanne Hirsch, an art professor at Temple University and Manor College (Jenkintown).

"The Philadelphia Sketch Club sees as its role to provide aspiring artists with the opportunity to exhibit their work," said Dorothy Roschen, the club member who chaired the High School Art Show. "We want to spread the word of the wonders of the arts to more people, and contribute to the next generation of artists."

As America's oldest club for artists, the Philadelphia Sketch Club has offered visual artists the means to assist each other in their art and promoted the appreciation of art in the greater Philadelphia community since 1860. The club's activities include 20 art exhibitions every year, presentations by leaders in the local art world, critique sessions to give artists constructive comments on their works, and six workshops per week for practice in painting and sketching. Membership now totals about 240 professional artists who value the culture of mutual assistance in the club's historic home in Philadelphia. This culture is the same one valued by the club's founders and early members, who include Thomas Eakins and N. C. Wyeth.
