Work must be framed and ready to hang. Artist Name, Title, Price, and Medium must be attached to the back of the piece.

Entry Fee: free to submit pieces

Submissions: You can submit up to two pieces per person.

Deadline for submissions: December 22nd, 2021.

Delivery: Work will be delivered during workshops via workshop monitor. Or during office hours Wednesdays and Fridays 11Am-5PM.

Pick up: Work will be available to be picked up during workshops starting January 24th to January 31st Or during office hours Wednesdays and Fridays 11Am-5PM.
